COMMENTS

This week's sale had an offer quantity of 7.3 m/kgs. Low Grown Leafy teas totaled 2.1 m/kgs whilst Tippy/Small Leaf teas accounted for 1.3 m/kgs and High Grown teas on offer in the Ex-Estate catalogue amounted 1.1 m/kgs.

There was fairly good demand for leafy and tippy/small leaf teas. Leafy BOP1's / OP1's were fully firm, whilst OP / OPA's were fully firm to dearer. Shotty Pekoes were fully firm whilst others ruled firm to dearer. However, leafy teas did not enjoy the same levels of demand on the second day of the sale, and, most grades consequently sold at lower prices than what was recorded the previous day. Select best, stylish, FBOP's and FBOPF1's were mostly dearer whilst, the balance, sold around at firm levels. Teas at the bottom end were dearer up to Rs. 10/. Tippy teas continued to attract good interest, with buyers for the Middle East showing enhanced interest on a wide range of teas. Buyers for Russia, Turkey and the C I S were also active for their buying standards. Iraq and Libya continued strong for secondary teas.

There was much less demand for Ex Estate teas, with only a limited selection of brighter Westerns which were in receipt of special interest. The majority of poor leaf, plain liquoring teas received hardly any interest, and, quite often, the only noise was that of the Broker on the rostrum trying hard to muster a suitable bid, as against reverberating bidding voices of buyers that are usually heard on auction days. CTC teas with maintained leaf held firm whilst others were irregular. There was much less demand from "Tea Bag" buyers operating for Russia. Buyers for China, Japan, Hong Kong and Europe were selective.

- BOP1** : Select best invoices maintained; balance firm on last week levels. Teas at the lower end were irregularly lower.
- OP1** : Teas in the select best category were barely steady; balance declined Rs.40-50/- per kg and difficult of sale particularly towards the end. Stalky invoices too declined Rs.20-30/- per kg.
- OP** : A few teas in the select best category held firm; balance was irregularly lower by Rs.10-20/- per kg. Teas at the lower end declined substantially.
- OPA** : Select best invoices declined Rs.40-50/- per kg and at times more; balance however maintained last week levels. Poorer sorts declined substantially and difficult of sale as the sale progressed.
- PEK/PEK1**: Well-made shotty invoices maintained; balance was lower by Rs.20/- per kg and at times more. Best bolder PEK's met with a good demand; balance was Rs.10-20/- per kg dearer. Teas at the lower end were generally lower.

Nuwara Eliyas were mostly unsold. Udapussellawas were firm to marginally easier. Uvas - few select teas Rs.10-20/- per kg dearer, others lower by a similar margin.

BOPF: Better Western BOPF's where quality was maintained were selectively dearer following special inquiry, others irregular and easier. Teas in the below best category Rs.20-30/- per kg lower. At the lower end clean leaf coloury sorts Rs.20-30/- per kg dearer whilst the poor leaf sorts were lower by a similar margin. Nuwara Eliyas were barely steady. BANGLADESH AUCTION

Sale No.12 held on Tuesday, 23rd July, 2019.

CTC LEAF: 53,422 packages of Current Season & 874 packages of Old Season Teas on offer met with a good demand.

BROKENS: Brokens grades were a strong feature following competition and were often dearer particularly the improved liquoring sorts. Medium Brokens also met with a good demand and were about steady. Plainer types met with some interest but sold at easier rates with fair withdrawals.

FANNINGS: Coloury Fannings met with a good demand and were mostly steady on last. Medium varieties were well absorbed at slightly easier rates. Plain types met with some demand but were easier with fair withdrawals.

CTC DUST: 10,322 packages of Current Season & 40 packages of Old Season Teas on offer met with a fairly good demand. Good liquoring varieties were well competed for and sold at around last levels. The remainder also sold well but eased by Tk.3/- to Tk.5/-. Plainer and BLF were irregular and easier with fair withdrawals. Blenders were active on brighter liquoring sorts whilst Loose Tea buyers mostly operated on plain and BLF categories.

COMMENTS: There was a better demand this week emanating particularly from the Blenders. Loose tea buyers lent some support. As a result, a little more teas were sold this week. BLF teas met with only selective enquiry and only a few were sold at much easier rates. There were again heavy withdrawals.

CTC LEAF

Demand: Fair demand. Larger brokens are selling at irregular levels. Fannings ruled at barely steady levels with selective demand from Internal and Upcountry buyers. Export buyers lent fair support.

LEAF-ORTHODOX:

Demand: Better demand.

Market: Market ruled at irregular levels for the well-made whole leaf and bolder brokens. Whole leaf grades and mediums selling at fully firm levels. Smaller brokens and plainer sorts had less demand and eased in value with heavy withdrawals.

Buying Pattern: CIS/Middle East exporters were active. Upcountry buyers lent support on whole leaf grades.

DUST

Demand: Fair Demand

Market: Best liquoring popular finer grades and better mediums selling at around last levels. Bolder grades tending irregular and lower. Plainer bolder sorts were selling at easier levels.

Buying Pattern: Major blender AVT was active and KSCSC was selective on the best mediums with fair support from regional packeters. Domestic buyers were less active in their purchases. Exporters were selective.

CTC LEAF

Demand: Strong

Market: Market generally opened on an irregular and lower levels by Rs. 2/- to Rs. 3/- and more at times on the Best and Better liquoring types. As the sale progressed the market has gained momentum and went on to be sold at fully firm to dearer levels by Rs. 2/- to Rs. 4/-, that makes the overall prices at on par with last week.

Buying Pattern: Good enquiry was forthcoming from the Major Blenders with equally good support from the Internal buyers. Exporters were lending fair support and mostly operating on the Plainers.

Buying Pattern: Fairly good Export enquiry with Madhu Jayanthi and IPL being active. Internal buyers were very selective.

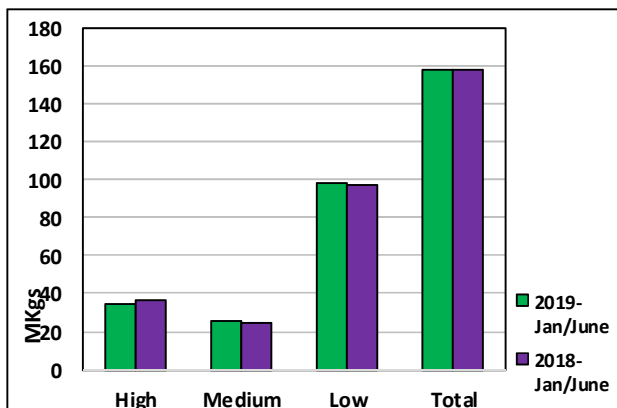
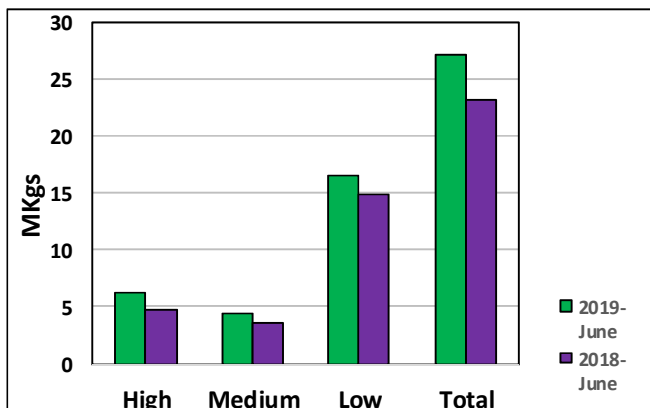
SRI LANKA TEA PRODUCTION- JUNE, 2019



The month of June 2019, has recorded a surplus crop of 3.9 Mkgs over the corresponding month last year following more favorable weather conditions experienced in all planting districts. The shortfall of 3.7 Mkgs in the cumulative tea production up to end May 2019 has now been completely wiped out as a result of the better crop for June, 2019 and, given below are more comprehensive details relating to tea production.
