COMMENTS

North East Monsoonal conditions are now firmly established over the Eastern side of the island and strong winds together with heavy precipitation exceeding 100 mm is predicted almost immediately over the eastern slopes. Estates in the Uva as well as plantation cover up to the Sabaragamuwa district, Uda Pussellawa and Nuwara Eliya regions will be prone to wet weather conditions in the coming days with a likelihood of reduced crop intakes as well. In the meanwhile, some exceptional teas are being currently produced by selected Western High Grown factories and, vastly improved quality teas from these factories will be on offer throughout January in the New Year.

This week's quantity of 5.9 m/kg showed a gain of 0.9 m/kgs from last auction's figure. Low Grown Leafy/Tippy/Premium Flowery Grades comprised of 2.7 m/kgs, whilst Main Sale High & Medium category teas totaled 0.8 m/kgs. Teas on offer in the Ex Estate catalogue amounted to 850,522 kgs.

Fair demand continued for both low grown leafy as well as tippy teas. Well-made BOP1's/OP1's were fully firm but OP/OPA's were firm to selectively dearer. Shotty Pekoes were selectively dearer although bolder types tended irregular. Buyers for Saudi Arabia, Syria and other Middle Eastern destinations were active whilst buying interest from Russia, and the C. I. S. was sustained. Turkey was more selective. In the "Tippy & Small Leaf" segment, demand from Iran was once again rather selective. The better FBOP's were irregularly easier whilst others held firm. Neat and well-made FBOPF1's were firm. The best tippy teas continued to find healthy demand.

High Grown teas in the Ex Estate catalogue opened to strong demand with below best brighter BOP's and BOPF's in particular gaining up to Rs. 20/- and sometimes more. CTC teas too commenced the sale with an all-round dearer market for high and medium elevational teas. Higher priced selected low grown PF1's sold around last whilst the balance was Rs. 20/- to 30/- lower. Towards the close of the sale however, there appeared to be more selective demand for below best category BOPF and PF1's following less vigorous buying by a few "bulk buyers" than in the first half of the auction. There was good interest from Japan, China, Hong Kong, Germany and other European buyers. Russia too was active.

This week's auction comprised of **11,171** lots with a total quantity of **5,984,625** kgs. The catalogue-wise breakdown was as follows:-

BOP1: Select best teas declined Rs.30-40/- per kg and at times more; balance however maintained last week levels. Teas at the lower end were barely steady.

OP1 : A few teas in the select best category held firm whilst others appreciated substantially. Stalky invoices too gained Rs.20-30/- per kg.

OP : Teas in the select best category maintained; balance declined by Rs.20/- per kg. Teas at the lower end gained Rs.20-30/- per kg.

OPA : Select best invoices were barely steady; balance were advanced Rs.10-20/- per kg. Poorer sorts advanced Rs.20-30/- per kg and at times more.

PEK/PEK1: Well-made shotty invoices were lower by Rs.10-20/- per kg; balance however appreciated Rs.20-30/- per kg. Best bold PEK's were lower by Rs.20/- per kg; balance too declined by Rs.20-30/- per kg. Teas at the lower end however met with a good demand.

varieties met with a good demand whilst below best were firm to dearer.

At the lower end, prices were firm. Nuwara Eliyas were irregular following quality. Udapussellawas – select high priced teas sold well following quality whilst the others were Rs.20-30/- per kg lower. Uvas continued to sell well.

BOPF: Best Westerns were irregular following quality. In the below best category, clean leaf coloury sorts were firm and Rs,20-3-/- per kg dearer whilst the ptjers were barely steady. At the lower end, clean leaf teas were Rs.20-30/- per kg dearer whilst the others were barely steady. Nuwara Eliyas were Rs.20/- per kg lower. Udapussellawas – select best varietites were Rs.29-30/- per kg dearer whilst the others were irregular following quality. Uas – select invoices gained Rs.20/- per kg and substantially more following special inquiry whilst the others were Rs.10-20/- per kg lower.

Western Region - Bright mornings and intermittent evening showers were reported throughout the week in the region. The Department of Meteorology predicts strong winds up to 40-50 kmph in the week ahead.

Nuwara Eliya Region -_Heavy rain fall was reported throughout the week and according to the Department of Meteorology heavy rain fall (above 75-100 mm) is expected to continue in the days to come.

Uva/Udapussellawa Regions - Dry mornings with scattered evening showers were experienced throughout the week in both regions. Heavy rain fall (above 100-150 mm) is forecast in the week ahead.

Low Growns - Both Ruhuna and Sabaragamuwa regions reported bright mornings and occasional evening showers. The Department of Meteorology predicts misty mornings in the Sabaragamuwa Region in the week ahead.

Crop Intake - Nuwara Eliya, Uva, Ruhuna and Sabaragamuwa regions showed an increase in the crop intake, whilst the Western and Udapussellawa regions maintained the crop intake.

BROKENS: A select few well-made teas met with a fairly good interest and were generally firm whilst the Medium and other varieties met with less demand and there are heavier withdrawals in these categories. Larger Broken were also mostly discounted. Poor varieties suffered heavy withdrawals and where sold recorded a decline of Tk.10/- and more.

FANNINGS: A small weight of good fannings met with a fairly good demand and were generally firm to slightly dearer. Medium varieties saw a fair demand but were easier with quality. Plain types continued to prove difficult of sale with considerable withdrawals.

CTC DUST: 8,768 packages of Current Season teas on offer met with a fair demand. CDs sold well at around last levels. Medium varieties sold a discount of Tk.5/- to Tk.10/- per kg.
