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SALE NO.04 OF 28TH/29TH JANUARY, 2020

COMMENTS

There has been a break in the dry spell of weather experienced in the hill country with some evening showers reported from parts of Dimbulla, Nuwara Eliya and Uda Pussellawa. The low crop intakes that are being presently experienced are expected to show some improvement by around the second week of February. Meanwhile, plantations in the South as well as Sabaragamuwa districts have not reported much change in the dry conditions. An all-round lowering of crop has been reported from all regions.

The Sri Lanka Tea Production figures for last December, and the year 2019 are yet to be announced by the Sri Lanka Tea Board. The total tea production for the year 2018 was 303.8 m/kgs whilst 2017 was 307 m/kgs. One can therefore see a progressive decline over the immediate past few years, and the final figure for 2019 may not hold out much promise of a reversal of that trend.

This week's sale comprised of a total quantity of 6.9 m/kgs which was approximately 0.7 m/kgs lower to the previous week's volume. Low Grown Leafy/Tippy/Premium Flowery Grades comprised of 3.3 m/kgs, whilst Main Sale High & Medium category teas totaled 700,000 kgs. Teas on offer in the Ex Estate catalogue amounted to almost 1 m/kgs.

Fair demand was witnessed for Low Growns. Stylish and well-made leafy BOP1's and OP1's were generally firm whilst the better OP's/OPA's too held last levels. However the secondary leafy teas were easier following more selective buying. A range of selected Pekoes were firm but others ruled irregular. FBOP's and FBOPF1's were generally lower. A limited selection of the best tippy parcels maintained previous prices. The balance was irregularly lower. Most low grown teas suffered further lowering of prices on the second day of the sale.

High Grown teas in the Ex Estate catalogue generally met with lower demand except for selected brighter westerns in the "best" category which gained Rs. 10/- to 30/- per kg, following air mail interest. Below best teas eased Rs. 10/- to 20/- whilst Uva's were sharply lower. A large liquoring buyer who was active during the last several weeks operated on a low key which resulted in subdued demand. Russian buyers for the "Tea Bag" segment were active at lower levels but interest from Hong Kong, Taiwan and Western Europe was below expectations. CTC PF1's from all elevations were much lower with prices falling more from towards the middle of the Brokers Order of Sale.

LOW GROWNS - LEAFY

- **BOP1** : A few select best invoices maintained following quality; balance tended irregular. Teas at the lower end were barely steady.
- **OP1** : Teas in select best category declined Rs.40-50/- per kg and at times more; balance was maintained. Stalky invoices appreciated substantially.
- **OP** : Select best together with best varieties declined by Rs.10-20/- per kg; balance was fully firm on last week levels. Teas at the lower end gained substantially.
- **OPA** : A few select best invoices held firm; balance tended Rs.10-20/- per kg. Poorer sorts advanced substantially.
- **PEK/PEK1:** Well-made shotty invoices tended irregular; balance declined Rs.20-30/- per kg following quality. Best bold PEK's were barely steady; balance was lower by Rs.20-30/- per kg and at times more. Teas at the lower end were generally firm.

- **FBOP/FBOP1** : Few select best FBOP's maintained. Balance together with best were easier. Cleaner below best and cleaner teas at the lower end sold around last levels. Balance together with the bold varieties declined. FBOP1's in general were easier.
- FBOPF/FBOPF1 : Very tippy teas continue to attract good demand. Best too sold around last levels. Few cleaner below best maintained. Others together with teas at the lower end were lower following quality. Few select best FF1's were firm. Balance together with best were easier. Few cleaner below best sold on last levels. Balance declined, however teas at the lower end were fully firm.

FBOPFSP/EXSP : Select best and the best teas were firm on last week's level. All others were irregularly lower.

In the below best category, the brighter sorts were firm, whilst the others were irregular and tended easier. At the lower end, clean leaf varieties were firm, whilst the others were barely steady. Nuwara Eliyas were neglected. Uda Pussellawas were firm. Better Uvas declined, whilst the others were firm.

BOPF: Best Westerns - brighter sorts were Rs.10-20/- per kg dearer, whilst the others were irregularly lower. Below best types declined Rs.10-20/- per kg and more. At the lower end, clean leaf varieties were dearer by Rs. 10/- per kg, whilst the others were irregular. Nuwara Eliyas were neglected. Uda Pussellawas were firm. Best Uvas on ofer declined sharply, whilst the others were firm.

# **TEA NEWS**

### Kenya's tea export earnings fall 16 per cent in 2019 on low prices

### On Friday, the 24th of January 2020.

Tea industry regulator of Kenya had released a statement saying that the <u>\$99.24 billion lower-middle income economy of Kenya</u>, ranked 22nd in the African continent, had witnessed its earnings from tea exports curbing out sharply last year, while a perspicacious bunch of industry analysts were quoted saying a multi-year low tea price amid growing competition in the sector had led to a 16.4 drop in Kenya's earnings from tea exports last year.

On top of that, Kenya's tea industry regulator had also added in Friday's (January 24th) statement that a lower production last year due to a severe drought alongside a drop in its average price had contributed to a lower tea export earnings last year, while the East African nation's tea production was curbed by 6.95 per cent last year.

Besides, according to Friday's (January 24th) statement from Kenya's Tea Directorate, average price of Kenya's tea dropped by 14.38 per cent to \$2.21 per kilogram in year from a \$2.58 per kilogram on a year-on-year basis, while the regulator said, "**Lower earnings were attributed to low auction prices**," adding Kenyan tea production would likely to step up marginally this year alongside export earnings.

### - OTHER MARKETS -

### **BANGLADESH AUCTION**

### Sale 38 held on Tuesday 27th January, 2020.

**CTC LEAF:** 36,107 packages of Current Season teas on offer met with a limited demand with heavy withdrawals continuing.

**BROKENS:** A limited quantity of clean BOP's met with a fair demand and sold at slightly easier rates but the bulk of the offerings which continued of inferior quality met with a very restricted demand and only a few lines sold at a discount over last particularly the Medium varieties. Poorest met with a fair demand but there were again heavy withdrawals.

**FANNINGS:** A limited weight of clean Fannings met with a fair demand and sold fairly well in line with quality. All other types saw a much less demand and there were heavier withdrawals. Poor types witnessed some interest at lower rates.
