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SALE NO.11 OF 16TH/17TH MARCH 2021

<u>COMMENTS</u>

The National Tea Production for February, 2021 has been released and stands at 22,379,398 kgs which records a positive variance of 4,166,105 kgs over the corresponding month in 2020. The Jan/Feb production of 2021 is 45.5 m/kgs, and is ahead of last year's figure by 5.3 m/kgs. This year's higher output for Jan/Feb has largely been possible due to the surplus of 5.3 M/kgs recorded by Low Elevational teas as against declines of -216,480 kgs for High Elevational teas and -8,907 kgs for Mid Growns.

This week's tea auction (Sale # 11) was conducted on March 9 & 10 (Tue/Wed) and, the offer quantity of 6.1 m/kgs was similar to the previous week. The Low Grown Leafy/ Semi Leafy/ Tippy & Small Leaf/ Premium Flowery catalogues totaled 2.7 m/kgs down 0.2 m/kgs from the previous sale, whilst Main Sale High & Medium category amounted to 0.68 m/kgs. The Ex Estate catalogue had approximately 1 m/kgs.

Once again there was less demand witnessed for Ex Estate teas, with the select best Western BOP's and BOPF's easing Rs. 20/- to 30/- per kg and their corresponding "below-best" counterparts losing Rs. 20/- and more for teas with a drop in leaf appearance. Nuwara Eliya BOP's / BOPF's with maintained quality were keenly sought after with intense demand from Japan and Germany. Uva/Uda Pussellawa BOP's and BOPF's were Rs. 10/- to 20/- lower, and more for poor leaf types. CTC PF1's from all elevations eased Rs. 10/- to 20/- per kg, and more towards the close while BP1's too were irregular. Buyers for China and Hong Kong showed fair interest at lower levels. Russia was more subdued for "Tea Bag" types.

There was fair demand for Low Growns. The better leafy OP1's ruled dearer while below-best varieties firm to selectively dearer and, OP/OPA's were fully maintained. In the semi-leafy catalogue, BOP1's were firm with well-made PEK/PEK1's firm to selectively dearer and poorer types irregularly easier. The best available FBOP's and FBOPF1's were firm but the balance ranged between firm to selectively dearer, and, irregularly lower for poorer leaf. Buyers for Iran were more selective, while Syria and other Gulf States were active. Russia and the CIS operated for leafy descriptions. Turkey was active. There was continued good interest at the bottom from Iraq and Libya.

This week's auction comprised of **11,051** lots with a total quantity of **6,177,705** kgs.

- **BOP1** : A few select best invoices held firm; balance was generally lower. Teas at the lower end tended irregular.
- **OP1** : Teas in the select best category were maintained; balance too fully firm on last week levels. Stalky invoices held firm.
- **OP** : Select best teas were lower by Rs.20/- per kg; balance was barely steady. Teas at the lower end tended irregular.
- **OPA** : Select best invoices was declined by Rs.20-30/- per kg; balance was barely steady. Poorer sorts were generally lower.
- **PEK/PEK1:** Well made stalky invoices declined Rs.20-30/- and more as the sale progressed; balance too declined. Best bold Pekoes fully firm to dearer by Rs.10-20/-; balance tended irregular, Teas at the lower end were generally lower.

Crop & Weather

For the period 08/03/2021 to 14/01/2021

Western/Nuwara Eliya Regions: The Western and Nuwara Eliya regions reported sunny mornings and occasional evening showersthroughout the week. The Department of Meteorology expects rain in the Western Region and rainwith misty conditions in the Nuwara Eliya Region in the week ahead. Uva/Udapussellawa Regions: Both regions experienced clear mornings and evening showers. The Haputale and Madulsima regions reported rainy weather throughout the week. Isolated showers are expected in the weekahead by the Department of Meteorology. Low Growns: Bright mornings and occasional evening showers were reported in the Low Grown Region. Heavyshowers are expected in the Ruhuna and Sabaragamuwa regions by the Department of Meteorology in the week ahead.

Crop Intake: The Western, Nuwara Eliya and Uva regions maintained the crop intake, whilst the Udapussellawa Region and a few sub-districts in the Agarapatana Region reported a slight increase. The Low Grown Region maintained the crop intake, whilst a few sub-districts in the Ruhuna Region reported a slight decrease.

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BANGLADESH AUCTION- SALE NO.42 HELD ON MONDAY 15TH MARCH, 2021

CTC LEAF: 5,395 packages of Current Season and 3,172 packages of New Season Teas on offer met with a fairly strong demand at mostly firm rates.

BROKENS: A small weight of clean Brokens met with quite a strong demand and were mostly firm. All others sold well in line with quality.

FANNINGS: Likewise, a nominal weight of clean Fannings met with quite a strong demand and were mostly firm. The remainder sold at firm rates following quality.

CTC DUST: 1,906 packages of Current Season, 99 pac,.dull and plain CDs were withdrawn without bids. New Season Dusts met with good competition and sold in range between Tk.239/- and Tk.316/-.

COMMENTS: This was the last sale of the season where a small weight of tea was offered. The sale attracted strong interest from all sections of the market. Dusts sold well.

Rising import of cheap, poor quality tea under lens

Kolkata: India, despite being the world's second-largest producer of tea with a sizable surplus in its production-consumption ratio, has imported 47% more leaves at 23.4 million kg (mkg) in 2020 against 15.9 mkgs in 2019. The country has been witnessing its import bill shoot up every year as some traders and packers continue buying cheap and low-quality leaves from not-so-famous tea-producing nations, such as Argentina, Indonesia and Vietnam, and, in turn, spoiling the reputation and price discovery of Indian tea.

Atul Asthana, MD and CEO, Goodricke Group, told TOI: "Importing poor quality tea spells disaster for the ailing industry. India's own tea production is increasing at a faster rate than the consumption growth, resulting in a surplus of tea stock. On top of that, import of poorquality tea is going to further create an imbalance in the supply-demand equation."

Tea Inc has spent Rs 403.2 crore for importing 23.4 mkgs tea in 2020, while in 2019, the expense stood at Rs 239.1 crore for 15.9 mkgs. Tea buys from Vietnam, Indonesia and Nepal have almost doubled in 2020 against that of 2019, according to the latest Tea Board data.

"We have to find out the real reason behind the import of such low-priced and substandard tea. It is a pity that a giant and renowned tea producer like India is buying the morning cuppa from countries like Kenya (6.9mkg in 2020), Vietnam (1.6mkg), Indonesia (0.84mkg) and Argentina (0.6mkg). Questions of proper quality check as per FSSAI norms and detection of 'country of origin' arise here," said Sujit Patra, secretary, Indian Tea Association (ITA), the premier planters' body.

Industry experts are skeptical of the fact that not all batches of the imported leaves are re-exported, and seldom is any duty paid for the 'retained' tea. In a letter to the Tea Board and the ministry of commerce and industry, the Indian Tea Exporters' Association (ITEA) had drawn the government's attention to the increase in duty-free tea imports, which are only meant for re-export. ITEA has demanded spot checks on use of tea imports and invoices.

"While some tea imports from cheap tea-producing nations are genuinely used for blending and re-export as 'multi-origin tea', a portion of the duty-free imports is being offloaded in the Indian market or being re-exported as 'Indian' or 'Assam' tea, taking advantage of evading the 100% usual import duty on tea. This is nothing but a form of adulteration. It spoils true price discovery and the image of Indian tea," pointed out Anshuman Kanoria, chairman, ITEA.

Industry sources said that some exporters have been claiming and receiving MEIS subsidy from the government also on re-export of imported tea although this is not allowed as per the Foreign Trade Policy (FTP). According to the ITA secretary, 50% value addition norm for re-export is too less for low-priced imported teas and it should be minimum 100% to make the level-playing field vis-a-vis indigenous tea.

ITEA has sought proper vigil on the use of imported leaves in India and initiate an investigation into possible violations in re-export of the duty-free imported leaves. "All genuine exporters are being driven out of markets by such importers, some of whom may also be fudging books to dump duty-free imports into the Indian market by evading duty, resulting in a huge loss to the exchequer," added Kanoria.

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
