TEA MARKET REPORT

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SALE NO.12 OF 23RD/24TH MARCH 2021

COMMENTS

This week's tea auction (Sale # 12) was conducted on March 23 & 24 (Tue/Wed) and, the offer quantity of 6.2 m/kgs was marginally higher than the previous week. The Low Grown Leafy/ Semi Leafy/ Tippy & Small Leaf/ Premium Flowery catalogues totaled 2.8 m/kgs, up 0.1 m/kgs from the previous sale, whilst Main Sale High & Medium category amounted to 0.7 m/kgs. The Ex Estate catalogue had 1 m/kgs.

The Ex Estate market sentiment was bearish with the exception of select best Westerns and Nuwara Eliya's which received fair interest supported by Air Mail demand. In the below-best category, Western BOP's with good leaf were firm to irregularly lower whilst their corresponding BOPF's lost Rs. 20/- and plainer BOPF's eased Rs. 20/- to 30/- per kg. Uva/Uda Pussellawa BOP's declined Rs. 20/- to 30/- whilst BOPF also followed a similar trend. CTC teas once again encountered weak demand and both BP1's and PF1's lost Rs. 20/- to 30/- per kg. A major international liquoring buyer operated very selectively on Rotorvane teas and showed still less interest for CTC teas, whilst the largest local buyer too showed subdued interest. There was fair interest from the UK, Japan and Germany for best Westerns. Buyers for China and Hong Kong showed fair interest at lower levels. Russia was moderately active for "Tea Bag" types. The majority of High Grown plantations have been severely affected by the rapid decline in prices seen over the immediate past few weeks with this week's prices being well below the "cost of production". The current levels however, are attractive to bulk buyers in overseas markets, and it is hoped that this in turn would direct fresh buying orders which will drive demand upwards in the ensuing auctions.

Low Grows continued to attract fair demand. The better leafy OP1's and the improved below-best OP1's were firm while well-made OP/OPA's too maintained previous levels, although below-best sorts tended irregular. Stylish BOP1's were again firm. Shotty and well-made PEK/PEK1's were firm to selectively dearer but poorer teas sold at reduced levels. Well-made FBOP's and FBOPF1's were firm but the balance was largely irregular and lower. Buyers for Iran were again rather selective, while Syria and other Gulf States continued to purchase their usual volumes. The CIS operated for leafy descriptions with greater force. Turkey was active but selective. There was continued good interest at the bottom from Iraq and Libya.

This week's auction comprised of **11,101** lots with a total quantity of **6,235,352** kgs.

- BOP1** : Select best invoices were irregular; balance was generally lower. Teas at the lower end tended irregular.
- OP1** : Teas in the select best category were maintained; balance declined by Rs.30/- per kg. Stalky invoices held firm.
- OP** : Select best teas were lower by Rs.20/- per kg; balance declined by Rs.20/- per kg. Teas at the lower end tended irregular.
- OPA** : Select best invoices declined by Rs.20-30/- per kg; balance were barely steady. Poorer sorts generally firm.
- PEK/PEK1**: Well made stalky invoices declined Rs.20-30/- and more as the sale progressed; balance too lost. Best bold Pekoes fully firm ; balance tended irregular, Teas at the lower end were generally lower.

In the Below Best category, a selection of brighter invoices were firm to marginally easier, whilst the others together with teas at the lower end declined Rs. 20 per kg and more. Nuwara Eliya's continued to sell well. Uva/Uda Pussellawa's declined Rs. 20-30 per kg and more as the sale progressed.

BOPF: Best Western's - Select high priced teas of last week tend to fluctuate following quality/special inquiry, whilst the others declined Rs. 20 per kg and more. In the Below Best category, brighter sorts were barely maintained, whilst the others together with teas at the lower end declined Rs. 20 per kg. Few select Nuwara Eliya's sold well, whilst the others were irregular and easier. Uda Pussellawa's declined Rs. 20-30 per kg, whilst Uva's were firm with select invoices appreciating following special inquiry.

Crop & Weather

For the period 15/03/2021 to 21/03/2021

Western/Nuwara Eliya Regions - The Nuwara Eliya Region experienced bright weather throughout the week, whilst the Western Region reported bright mornings and evening showers. According to the Department of Meteorology, rain is expected in both regions in the week ahead. **Uva/Udapussellawa Regions** - The Uva and Udapussellawa regions reported clear mornings and evening showers, whilst selective sub-districts in the Haputale and Kandapola regions experienced bright weather throughout the week. The Department of Meteorology expects heavy showers in the Uva Region in the week ahead. **Low Grown** - Sunny mornings and occasional evening showers were reported in the Low Grown Region throughout the week. Heavy showers are expected in the Sabaragamuwa and Ruhuna regions in the week ahead by the Department of Meteorology.

Crop Intake - The Western, Nuwara Eliya and Low Grown regions maintained the crop intake, whilst an increase in the crop intake was reported in the Uva and Udapussellawa regions.

BANGLADESH FIRST E-AUCTION HELD ON 15.03.2021

E-AUCTION: The Inaugural sale of the Digital Auction comprising of a nominal quantity of tea took place today with all sections of the trade participating. The Government was represented by a senior officer of Bangladesh Tea Board. The sale was participated online by a large number of buyers, and judging by the enthusiasm displayed, the prospect for a larger scale adoption looks promising.

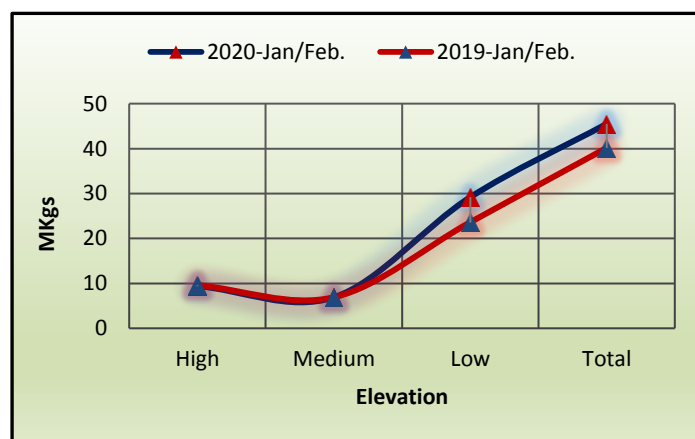
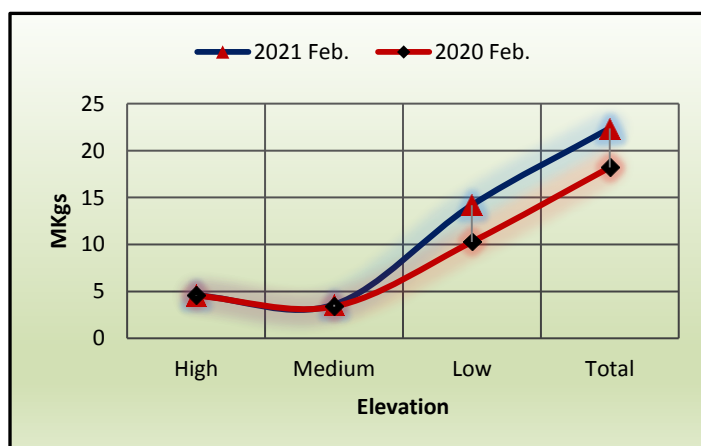
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The Sri Lanka Tea Production of 22.3Mkgs for February 2021 shows an improvement of 4.1Mkgs over February 2020. Analyzing the contribution made by the High, Medium and Low Grown elevations towards this increase, it will be noted that the Low Grown elevation has made the biggest impact with a gain of 3.9Mkgs whilst High & Medium elevations have contributed less than 0.25Mkgs. During the period January to February 2021, a total harvest of 45.5Mkgs from all three elevations is a gain of 5.3 Mkgs over the crop figure of 40.1Mkgs recorded during last year's corresponding period.
