COMMENTS

This week's tea auction (Sale # 14) was conducted on April 6 & 7 (Tue/Wed) and, the offer quantity of 6.5 m/kgs was similar to that of the previous week. The Low Grown Leafy/ Semi Leafy/ Tippy & Small Leaf/ Premium Flowery catalogues totaled 2.9 m/kgs, whilst Main Sale High & Medium category amounted to 0.8 m/kgs. The Ex Estate catalogue had 0.9 m/kgs. Colombo will skip an auction next week on account of the Sinhala & Tamil New Year holidays and the next tea sale is scheduled for April 20 & 21, 2021.

The National Elevational Averages for March, 2021 have been released and a significant feature is the much stronger averages secured by all orthodox elevational categories as compared to the corresponding month last year. In the case of CTC teas however, all three elevations have recorded month-on-month declines ranging from – Rs.21.25 for CTC High and – Rs.11.34 for CTC Mediums. CTC Low category eased the sharpest with a drop of Rs.30.42.

The Ex Estate market witnessed good and renewed demand. Select best BOP's were much lower following quality while their corresponding BOPF's were lower to a lesser extent. In the below-best category however, neater BOP's gained Rs. 20/- to 30/- and their BOPF's appreciated Rs. 20/- to 50/-. Nuwara Eliya's continued to be keenly sought after and recorded tall prices. Uva/Uda Pussellawa BOP's were irregular and lower but their BOPF's advanced Rs. 20/- to 30/-. CTC BP1's were firm to irregularly easier but PF1's generally gained Rs. 20/- per kg across all three elevations particularly where leaf appearance was maintained. There was better demand from the UK, Japan and Germany for best Westerns. Buyers for China and Hong Kong were more active. There was welcome revived interest from Russia for "Tea Bag" types.

Demand was selective and more focused towards teas with good make and style. A range of select best OP1's, OP's, and OPA's were maintained whilst teas in the below best category were easier. BOP1's were mostly easier but a range of the best available PEK/PEK1's were firm although mixed leaf teas saw lower prices. The teas on offer in the "Tippy / Small Leaf Catalogue" too saw irregularly lower prices with the exception of a limited range of the best FBOPF1's which were firm. The Middle Eastern buyers and those operating for the C.I.S were more selective and purchased their requirements at lower price levels. Interest from Germany and some selected Far Eastern markets too was on the wane. Buyers mostly purchased teas against their immediate pending orders and bulk buyers operated on a low key possibly in view of the upcoming Sinhala & Tamil New Year holidays where processing auction purchases for shipment becomes a challenge in view of factory workers availing themselves of the holidays.

This week's auction comprised of **11,712** lots with a total quantity of **6,575,411** kgs.

LOW GROWNS - LEAFY/SEMI

- BOP1** : Select best teas were lower by Rs.40-50/- and at times more; balance too declined but up to a lesser extent. Teas at the lower end were generally easier.
- OPI** : Best teas were maintained; balance was declined Rs.20-30/- per kg. Stalky invoices too lower by Rs.20/- and at times more.
- OP** : Select best invoices were easier whilst best teas sold around last levels; balance was irregularly lower. Teas at the lower end too declined.
- OPA** : Teas in the select best category declined substantially; balance was barely steady. Poor sort were easier by Rs.20-30/- per kg.
- PEK/PEK1**: A few select best invoices met with a good demand whilst best category declined Rs.20-30/- per kg; balance too lower and at times were difficult of sale. Bold pekoes were declined by Rs.20-30/-. Teas at the lower end too easier.

Balance together with Best declined. However, Cleaner Below Best and cleaner teas at the lower end were firm. Others were lower following quality.
- FBOPFSP/EXSP** : Invoices in the top category and the below best held firm. Teas at the lower end sold at last week levels.

Crop & Weather

For the period 29 March – 04 April 2021

Western/Nuwara Eliya Regions: Both regions reported bright weather throughout the week, whilst a few sub-districts in the Bogawantalawa and Talawakelle regions reported overcast evenings. The Department of Meteorology expects misty conditions in the mornings and evening showers in both regions in the week ahead. **Uva/Udapussellawa Regions:** Sunny weather was reported in both regions throughout the week, whilst a few sub-districts in the Haputale Region reported dull weather with occasional showers in the evenings. **Low Grown:** The Low Grown Region reported clear weather throughout the week. Misty conditions are expected in the Sabaragamuwa Region during the morning hours, whilst evening showers are expected in the Ruhuna Region during the evening hours by the Department of Meteorology.

Crop Intake: The Western and Udapussellawa regions reported a slight increase in the crop intake, whilst the Nuwara Eliya Region maintained. The Low Grown and Uva regions reported a decrease in the crop intake.
