MONTHLY AVERAGES - APRIL, 2021

The monthly national averages for April, 2021 have been released which shows a month-on-month drop for almost all categories. The sharpest declines are seen from the orthodox Uva Medium, Western Medium and Low Grown categories, whilst, in the case of CTC teas a drop of Rs. 23.31 is observed from the previous month for CTC High teas. During the month under review, CTC Medium and Low teas have however, have been able to benefit from more international demand from the "Tea Bag" sector and also added interest from local brand owners, and thus avoid a marked decline.

This week's tea auction (Sale # 17) was conducted on May 4 & 5 (Tue/Wed) and, the offer quantity of 7.0 m/kgs was similar to the previous sale. The Low Grown Leafy/ Semi Leafy/ Tippy & Small Leaf/ Premium Flowery catalogues totaled 3.06 m/kgs, whilst Main Sale High & Medium category amounted to 1 m/kgs. The Ex Estate catalogue also had 1 m/kgs.

There was fair general demand at easier levels for Ex Estate teas in the back drop of a greater weight of plainer liquoring teas. Best western BOP's and BOPF's eased Rs. 20/- to 40/- but a range of cleaner teas in the below-best category sold at firm prices although poorer leaf teas eased up to Rs. 30/- per kg. Nuwara Eliya BOP's were sharply lower following quality, while BOPF were irregular and sometimes easier. Uda Pussellawa BOP's were about firm; BOPF's lost Rs. 20/- per kg. Uva's were generally Rs. 20/- lower for both Brokens and BOPF's. CTC PF1's from all elevational categories eased Rs. 20/- to 30/- with the exception of a limited selection of the best teas that held firm. There was selective demand from the UK, Japan and Germany for best Westerns. Buyers for China and Hong Kong were subdued. Russia operated for "Tea Bag" types at lower levels. Additionally, there was some interest from brand owners operating for the local market.

Low growns enjoyed fair demand. Well-made OP1's were fully maintained whilst bolder types tended irregular and lower. Better OP/OPA's were well supported by Russia and the CIS and saw firm to selectively dearer prices. Stylish BOP1's too were firm and readily saleable. Shotty Pekoes sold around last levels, but bolder types were a little easier. Bottom level leafy and semi leafy teas generally were fully firm amidst more wide-spread demand for price-cutters. The Gulf region was active though selective for the teas in the 'best' and 'below-best' categories. Turkey was selective. Iran was active for well-made FBOP's and FBOPF1's which ruled firm, whilst the balance was irregularly lower following quality.

This week's auction comprised of **12,340** lots with a total quantity of **7,036,939** kgs.

OP : Select best teas were firm to irregularly lower by Rs.10-15/- per kg; balance too declined Rs.10-20/- per kg. Teas at the lower end were barely steady.

OPA: Select best invoices were fully firm to dearer by Rs.10-20- per kg; balance tended irregular. Poorer sorts maintained.

PEK/PEK1: Well-made shotty PEK1's were generally lower; balance too were irregularly lower. Best bold PEK's maintained; balance declined substantially and at times were difficult of sale.

BOP: Best Western's declined Rs. 20-40 per kg and more for select high priced teas of last week. In the Below Best category, few select coloury invoices were firm and up to Rs. 20 per kg dearer, whilst the others declined by a similar margin. Plainer clean leaf coloury sorts were Rs. 10-20 per kg dearer, whilst the others were irregularly easier. Nuwara Eliva's declined up to Rs. 50 per kg. Uda Pussellawa's were barely steady. Uva's – Better teas were Rs. 20-40 per kg lower, whilst the others were firm and lower to a lesser extent.

BOPF: Best Western's declined Rs. 20-30 per kg and more for select high priced teas of last week. In the Below Best category, clean leaf coloury sorts were firm, whilst the others declined Rs. 10-20 per kg. At the lower end too, coloury sorts were firm to marginally easier, whilst the thinner teas declined Rs. 20-30 per kg. Nuwara Eliya's – Select Best were firm, whilst the others were Rs. 20-30 per kg lower. Uda Pussellawa's declined Rs. 20 per kg and more following quality. Uva's were Rs. 20-30 per kg lower following quality.

Crop & Weather

For the period 26th April to 02nd May 2021

Western/Nuwara Eliya Regions - The Western Region reported bright mornings and evening showers, whilst the Nuwara Eliya Region reported bright mornings and scattered evening showers throughout the week. The Department of Meteorology expects heavy showers in both regions in the week ahead. **Uva/Udapussellawa Regions** - Sunny mornings and overcast evenings with rainfall were reported in both regions throughout the week. **Low Growns** - Clear mornings and evening showers were reported from the Low Grown Region, whilst a few subdistricts in the Ruhuna Region reported rainfall during the latter part of the day. Heavy showers are expected in the Ruhuna and Sabaragamuwa regions in the week ahead.

Crop Intake -

The Western, Uva/Uda Pussellawa regions reported an increase in the crop intake, whilst the Low Grown region maintained. The Nuwara Eliya Region reported a slight increase in the crop intake.

OTHER MARKETS

BANGLADESH AUCTION- SALE NO.01 HELD ON MONDAY 03RD MAY, 2021

CTC LEAF: 20,578 packages of Current Season and 1758 packages of Old Season teas on offer met with quite a fair demand although rather selectiv

BROKENS: A few best Brokens met with quite a strong demand and sold fairly well following competition and these fetched between Tk. 225/- and Tk.235/- and sometimes more. Other Brokens particularly the larger varieties were not as well competed for and eased in value. These sold between Tk. 210/- and Tk.225/-. Plain types met with limited interest and sold between Tk.190/ and Tk.195/- whilst BLF teas saw some interest and prices ranged between Tk. 165/- and Tk. 180/-.

FANNINGS: Best Fannings saw fair competition and generally sold around Tk.215/- to 225/-, others met with fair demand and prices realised between Tk.200/- and Tk.210/-. Plain types saw only limited interest and sold between Tk. 190/- and Tk.195/-. BLF teas saw some interest and prices ranged between Tk. 165/- and Tk. 180/-.

CTC DUST: 15,302 packages of Current Season and 190 packages of Old Season teas on offer met with a good demand. Ds and CDs met with good competition and sold at a range between Tk. 225/- and Tk.280/-. Others also sold well in line with quality. However, PDs and RDs were less in demand and saw fair withdrawals. Plain and BLF teas saw some interest but ranged between Tk.180/- and Tk. 210/-. Blenders lent quite good support with fair interest from the Loose tea buyers.

COMMENTS: This was the first sale of the season and despite the lockdown, there was a fair number of buyers operating in the auction. Blenders lent some support for the bright liquoring varieties whilst Loose tea buyers operated strongly on the well made popular marks. As a result, well made good liquoring teas realized substantially higher prices than other varieties.

A bright feature of the sale was the strong demand in the Dust Catalogue.
