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SALE NO.18 OF 11TH/12TH MAY, 2021

COMMENTS

This week's tea auction (Sale # 18) was conducted on May 11 & 12 (Tue/Wed) and, the offer quantity of 7.0 m/kgs was similar to the previous two sales. The Low Grown Leafy/ Semi Leafy/ Tippy & Small Leaf/ Premium Flowery catalogues totaled 3.06 m/kgs, whilst Main Sale High & Medium category amounted to 1 m/kgs. The Ex Estate catalogue also had 1.1 m/kgs.

There was less demand for Ex Estate teas following the greater availability of plainer liquoring teas. The limited range of best Western BOP's and BOPF's eased Rs.30/- to 40/- whilst cleaner teas in the below-best category eased up to Rs. 20/- and more as the sale progressed. Poor leaf teas were all lower and even neglected by the close. Nuwara Eliya BOP's and BOPF's were sharply lower following quality. Uda Pussellawa BOP's declined Rs.20/- to 30/- and BOPF's eased Rs. 30/- to 40/-. CTC PF1's from all elevational categories eased up to Rs.20/-, while BP1's were again neglected. There was subdued interest from the UK, Japan and Germany for Westerns. Buyers for China and Hong Kong operated selectively. Russia too was selective in their purchases for "Tea Bag" types at lower levels.

Low growns again enjoyed fair demand. Well-made OP1's were maintained whilst bolder types tended irregular and easier. True to grade OP/OPA's received ready enquiry from buyers for Russia and the CIS and were fully firm to selectively dearer. Stylish BOP1's in general were firm. Shotty Pekoes1's were fully firm to dearer. Better Pekoes maintained last levels while bold, mixed types were mostly easier. The Gulf buyers were active with more widespread interest for teas in the 'best' and 'below-best' categories. Turkey was active. Iran was active for well-made FBOP's and FBOPF1's which were firm to dearer, whilst the balance was irregularly lower following quality.

This week's auction comprised of 11,524 lots with a total quantity of 7,032,485 kgs.

BOP1 : Select best invoices maintained; balance was barely steady. Teas at the lower end tended irregular.

OP1: Teas in the select best category maintained; balance tended irregular. Stalky invoices declined by Rs.40/-50/-.

OP : Select best teas were firm to irregularly lower by Rs.10-15/- per kg; balance too declined Rs.10-20/- per kg. Teas at the lower end were barely steady.

OPA: Select best invoices were firm to lower by Rs.20/- per kg; balance tended irregular. Poorer sorts maintained.

PEK/PEK1: Well-made shotty PEK1's were generally lower; balance too were irregularly lower. Best bold PEK's too Declined by Rs.30-40/-; balance declined substantially and at times were difficult of sale.

: Well made shotty Pekoe1 types met with fair demand. Bold Pekoe's lost in value. Secondaries mixed and the

lower end types were mostly discounted.

HIGH GROWNS

BOP: Best Western's were Rs.30-40 per kg lower. Teas in the Below Best category which were firm and Rs.10-20 per kg lower following quality declined further as the sale progressed, whilst at the lower end prices were barely maintained. Nuwara Eliya's declined up to Rs.50 per kg. Uva/Uda Pussellawa's declined Rs. 20-30 per kg and more following quality.

BOPF: A majority of the Best Western's declined Rs.30-40 per kg and more for select high priced teas of last week. Teas in the Below Best category declined Rs.20 per kg and more as the sale progressed. At the lower end, prices which were firm to marginally easier at the commencement, declined further as the sale progressed particularly for the thinner liquoring teas. Nuwara Eliva's were substantially easier. Uda Pussellawa's declined Rs.30-40 per kg and more following quality, at times substantially. Uva's were Rs.20-40 per kg lower with the exception of a few select coloury invoices, which were lower to a lesser extent.

Crop & Weather

For the period 03rd to 09th May, 2021

Western/Nuwara Eliya Regions: Sunny mornings and afternoon showers were reported from the Western and Nuwara Eliya regions during the week. The Department of Meteorology expects heavy showers in both regions in the week ahead. Uva/Udapussellawa Regions: Clear mornings and afternoon showers were reported in both regions throughout the week. Thundershowers are expected in the Uva Region in the week ahead according to the Department of Meteorology. Low Growns: The Low Grown Region reported bright mornings and afternoon showers throughout the week. According to the Department of Meteorology, heavy showers are expected in the Ruhuna and Sabaragamuwa regions in the week ahead.

Crop Intake: The Western, Nuwara Eliya, Uva and Udapussellawa regions reported an increase in the crop intake. The Low Grown Region maintained the crop intake.

OTHER MARKETS

SOUTH INDIAN ROUND-UP FOR THE WEEK ENDING 08TH MAY. 2021

CTC LEAF KOCHI

Demand: Good demand. Brokens and Fannings were selling at fully firm to dearer levels by Rs.5 to 8 and sometimes more.

Good demand from Internal and Upcountry buyers. Export buyers were active.

LEAF-ORTHODOX:

Demand: Good demand.

Market: Well made high grown whole leaf, brokens sold at fully firm levels. Medium whole leaf and bolder brokens also sold at

fully firm to occasionally dearer levels whilst smaller brokens tended dearer.

Buying Pattern: CIS/Middle East exporters were active. Upcountry buyers lent support on whole leaf grades.

DUST

Demand: Fair demand.

Market: Popular varieties and good liquoring finer grades initially sold at barely steady levels and as the sale progressed

the market was fully firm to occasionally dearer. Plainer sorts witnessed better enquiry and selling at fully firm to

dearer levels.

Buying Pattern: Major blender AVT was active. KSCSC was inactive. Best mediums fetched with fair support from regional

packeeters. Domestic buyers were less active in their purchases. Exporters were selective.

CTC LEAF COONOOR

Demand: Strong.

Market: Generally a fully firm to dearer market with the Brokens and Smaller Brokens selling Rs. 5/- to Rs. 10/- dearer,

sometimes more following quality. The Fannings were also trading at Rs. 3/- to Rs. 5/- dearer and more on the Fairly blacker and cleaner types. The Bolder Brokens were selling at barely steady to occasionally dearer levels.

Buying Pattern: Strong enquiry was forthcoming from the Major Blenders with the Internal buyers supporting well. Export has been

selective.

ORTH LEAF

Demand: Fairly Good.

Market: Overall an easier trend with teas across all grades and categories selling at Rs.5/- to Rs.10/- and more upto Rs.20/-.

However some of the Secondary Brokens have sold at barely steady to occasionally dearer levels.

Buying Pattern: Strong Export enquiry was forthcoming with Fairly good support from the Internal buyers.

CTC DUST

Demand: Good.

Kenya - Tea auction prices depressed below 2-dollar mark

This comes amid increased global production and oversupply.

In Summary

- •The high supply of teas and exports by key global producing countries has affected the overall prices.
- •Production of the green leaf in Kenya has also gone up.

Average tea prices at the weekly Mombasa auction have remained below the preferred 2-dollar mark for nine weeks running, amid increased global production of the commodity. This week, the commodity averaged \$1.83 (Sh195.22) a kilo at the auction which is one of the largest in the world where teas from Kenya, Uganda, Rwanda, Tanzania, Malawi, Ethiopia and the Democratic Republic of Congo are traded. The price is a drop from last week's \$1.85 (Sh197.36) even as volumes traded dropped. Out of 187,943 packages (12,408,168.50) kilos) available for sale, 157,019 packages (10,389,432 kilos) were sold.15.97 per cent per cent packages remained unsold, the East African Tea Trade Association (EATTA) notes in its market report. The commodity has only fetched a 2-dollar overall average once this year at the hammer which came in the second week of March, when a kilo sold for an average Sh213.36.

This year's lowest price so far came in the second week of April when a kilo fetched \$1.81 (Sh193). This week's auction was marked with increased and strong inquiry from Egyptian packers with more support from Sudan while Yemen and other Middle Eastern countries lent more interest.

"UK increased activity but operated at lower levels with Kazakhstan, other CIS states and Russia active. Pakistan packers and Bazaar showed good interest but at lower rates with selective support from Afghanistan while Iran were more selective,"EATTA managing director Edward Mudibo notes in the report.

Local packers showed less interest on account of price. Somalia was active at the lower end of the market, EATTA says.

Last month, Kenya Tea Development Agency noted persistent high production and a global oversupply, which it said had pushed down the average tea prices for its managed factories. The low prices so far signal low earnings for farmers, who last year were cushioned by a stronger dollar against the shillings as prices remained low.

Top 10 tea exporting countries are China, India, Kenya, Sri Lanka, Turkey, Indonesia, Vietnam, Japan, Iran and Argentina.

Last year, average tea auction prices fell by six per cent compared to the previous year, blamed on the high production and a depressed market occasioned by the pandemic.

2020's full-year average price was \$1.80 (Sh192.02), which was lower compared to 2019, when it fetched an average \$2.05 (Sh218.69) at the Mombasa auction.
