### COMMENTS

The Western and Nuwara Eliya regions reported bright mornings and overcast evenings with scattered rains, whilst both Uva and Uda Pussellawa have experienced bright weather. Low Grown plantations also have mostly been dry apart from sporadic bursts of rain. The Department of Meteorology has confirmed that heavy showers could be expected in the Western, Nuwara Eliya and Low Grown plantation districts in the week ahead, and scattered showers in the Uva/Uda Pussellawa regions.

This week's tea auction (Sale # 30) was conducted on August 3 & 4 (Tue/Wed), and, the offer quantity of 6.77 mkgs was similar to the previous week's total. The Low Grown Leafy/ Semi Leafy/ Tippy & Small Leaf/ Premium Flowery catalogues totaled 2.9 mkgs, whilst Main Sale High & Medium had 0.8 mkgs and, Ex Estate category had 0.95 mkgs.

In the Ex Estate catalogue, good demand prevailed only for selected Westerns and some handpicked lots of seasonal Uva's that were keenly competed for by buyers for Japan, Germany and the UK. Balance teas suffered price declines with below-best Western BOP's and BOPF"s being irregular and lower by Rs. 10/- and plainer, poor leaf teas further discounted, particularly as the sale progressed. Nuwara Eliya's were irregularly lower following quality. Uda Pussellawa's had a disappointing sale yet again apart from a handful of selected teas that maintained previous levels. Uva BOP's and BOPF's that did not possess seasonal character were lower by Rs. 10/- to 20/- per kg. A limited selection of the best PF1's from the High and Low elevations held firm; others lost Rs. 10/- and more with the market weakening by the close of the sale. BP1's – continued irregular. Apart from buying interest shown by the UK, Germany and Japan for the best quality teas from both sides of the island, buyers for China and Hong Kong were selective, while Russia was fairly active at lower levels.

Low growns continued to meet with fair demand. Well-made OP1's were fully firm to selectively dearer whilst poorer teas held firm. The better OP's and OPA's were barely steady while bottom level teas were maintained. Selected BOP1's were irregular. The better Pek/Pek1's were firm but poorer, mixed varieties ruled easier. Neater FBOP's and FBOPF1's – were firm to selectively dearer. Below best teas were firm while the balance was easier. Middle Eastern buyers showed fair interest though tending to be selective. The CIS operated for better made leafy teas. Turkey was more selective and followed quality. Iran was active for neat and well-made FBOP's and FBOPF1's. Iraq operated for bottom level teas.

This week's auction comprised of **11,971** lots with a total quantity of **6,770,586** kgs.

**BOP1**: Select best BOP1's were maintained; balance was fully firm to Rs.10-20/- per kg dearer. Teas at the lower end tended irregular.

**OP1** : Teas in the select best category held firm; balance was irregularly lower. Stalky invoices were generally lower.

**OP** : Select best invoices declined substantially; balance too lost Rs.20-30/- per kg and at times more. Teas at the lower end were generally lower.

**OPA** : Teas at the select best category declined substantially; balance was lower by Rs.10-to 15/- per kg. Poor sorts tended irregular.

**PEK/PEK1:** Well-made PEK1's were fully firm on last week levels; balance was irregular. Best bold PEK's were maintained; balance too met with a fair demand. Teas at the lower end were mostly lower and at times were difficult of sale.

**BOP:** Best Western's - Select invoices were up to Rs. 20 per kg dearer following special inquiry whilst the others were irregular and often easier. In the Below Best category, select coloury invoices were firm and Rs. 10 per kg deare4 whilst the others declined by a similar margin and more. Plainer clean leaf sorts were barely steady, whilst the others were heavily discounted. Nuwara Eliya's were irregular following quality. Uda Pussellawa's were barely steady. Uva's - Seasonal teas realized attractive prices, whilst the others were Rs. 20-30 per kg lower.

**BOPF:** Best Western's - Select high priced teas were barely steady, whilst the others were firm and Rs. 10-20 per kg dearer selectively following quality/special inquiry. In the Below Best category better teas were firm to marginally deare4, whilst the others together with the Plainer sorts were irregular and barely steady. Nuwara Eliya's continued to be irregular following quality. Uda Pussellawa's were irregular and barely steady. Uva's - There were no seasonal teas on offer, whilst the other coloury sorts were firm and Rs. 10-20 per kg lower.

#### OTHER MARKETS-

## BANGLADESH AUCTION- SALE NO.12 HELD ON MONDAY 02ND AUGUST, 2021

**CTC LEAF**: 37,597 packages of Current Season & 160 packages of Old Season teas on offer continued to meet with less demand.

**BROKENS**: Best Brokens met with a fairly good demand and sold at slightly easier rates. Good and Medium varieties met with a fair demand and were also slightly easier. Plain and BLFs met with a selective demand at easier rates and witnessed more withdrawals.

**FANNINGS:** Best varieties of Fannings met with a fairly good demand but were again slightly easier following less competition. Good and Medium varieties met with a fair demand but were slightly easier. Plain and BLFs met with a selective demand at easier rates and witnessed more withdrawals.

CTC DUST: 10,721 packages of Current Season & 60 packages of Old Season teas on offer met with a good demand. Good liquoring Dusts sold well at easier rates particularly the CDs which also witnessed more withdrawals compared to last sale. Others were fairly well supported and sold at around last levels. Plain and BLFs met with selective demand at slightly easier rates with fair withdrawals. Blenders lent strong support with fair interest from the Loose tea buyers.

**COMMENTS:** Today's sale met with a fair demand but witnessed less competition throughout the sale. Good liquoring varieties met with a fairly good demand by major Blenders who were the mainstay of the market. Loose tea buyers were virtually absent.

Dust sold well.

Our catalogue (Sale 12): Avg: Tk 209.25, Sold 75.9% & (Sale 11) Avg: Tk 209.83, sold 68.2%.
