

LANKA COMMODITY BROKERS LTD TEA MARKET REPORT



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SALE NO.17 OF 03RD/04TH MAY, 2022 <u>C O M M E N T S</u>

This week's tea auction (Sale # 17) was conducted on May 03&04, 2022 (Tue/Wed/), with a weight of 5.9mkgson offer. The Low Grown Leafy, Semi Leafy, Tippy & Small Leaf/Premium Flowery catalogues totaled 2.4mkgs approx., whilst Main Sale High & Medium category had a weight of 0.79mkgs. The Ex Estate category had 0.82mkgs.

A lower trend was witnessed at this week's Ex-Estate sale with the exception of select best teas which maintained last levels on account of special inquiry. In the below best category, both BOP/BOPF's from all districts which were initially easier by Rs.100-200/- per kg declined further as the sale progressed particularly towards the latter part of the sale with many teas remaining unsold due to lack of suitable bids. In the CTC category, High & Medium select best PF1's were firm to Rs.20/- per kg dearer whilst the balance declined Rs. 30/- per kg and more for poorer varieties. Low Grown PF1's too on average lost Rs. 20-40/- per kg. The limited supply of BP1 in the market were keenly sought after and held fully firm to dearer. Russia and CIS as usual were active along with select demand from Japan, Germany and other markets for the best liquoring teas, whilst Far Eastern buyers too were active.

The demand for Low Grown teas continued to be sustained and were quoted fully firm to dearer. Bright Tippy varieties too followed a similar trend and was selectively dearer. Middle Eastern Buyers which included Turkey, Syria and Libya continued to be active along with the Russian and CIS buyers, whilst Iraq once again operated at the lower end of the market.

This week's auction comprised of 10,811 lots with a total quantity of 5,928,714 kgs.

- **FBOP/FBOP1** : Well made FBOP's together with cleaner Below Best firm to selectively dearer. Balance irregular following quality, FBOP1's in general were fully firm.
- **FBOPF/FBOPF1** : Well made FBOPF/FBOPF1's were firm to selectively dearer. However, cleaner Below Best and cleaner teas at the lower end held firm whilst others where quality did not maintain prices were irregular.
- **FBOPFSP/EXSP** : Very tippy teas continued to attract good demand whilst Below Best irregular following quality others maintained.

BOP: Best Western's - Select Best invoices were firm and Rs. 30-50/- per kg dearer whilst the others together with teas in the Be1ow Best category declined by a similar margin and more for the Plainer sorts. Nuwara Eliya's continued to sell well. Uva/Uda Pussellawa's declined Rs.200-300/- per kg.

BOPF: Best Western's - were irregular and declined up to Rs.100/- per kg. Teas in the Below Best category declined Rs.150-200/- per kg, whilst the Plainer sorts eased further. Nuwara Eliya's - Select invoices sold well, whilst the others were irregular and substantially lower. Uva/Uda Pussellawa's declined up to Rs.200/- per kg and more for the poorer sorts.

Sri Lanka chaos opens tea export opportunity that India may miss

India, the world's second-biggest tea producer, will likely fail to take advantage of an export gap in the global market sparked by Sri Lanka's economic crisis, according to a top grower.

The chaos in Sri Lanka could cut tea supplies by about 40 million kilograms in 2022, said Azam Monem, director at Mcleod Russel India Ltd., one of India's largest growers. While India has been touted to fill that gap, it's unlikely that it will be able to do so due to the high costs involved, Monem said.

Sri Lanka mainly produces orthodox tea, which tends to be harvested and processed by hand. It is popular with tea drinkers in Russia and some eastern European countries. Production costs are generally higher for orthodox tea and the output process might cause crop losses, according to Monem.

Local producers are reluctant to spend money to upgrade their output process on worries that the window to sell more orthodox tea would be available only for a limited period. Non-orthodox tea made by machines that crush, tear and curl, or CTC, accounts for about 85% of domestic output, according to Prabir Kumar Bhattacharjee, secretary general of the Tea Association of India. The cost to produce orthodox tea is 20 times more, Bhattacharjee said.

It would be difficult for the company to invest in upgrading its production process without government support, Monem added. Still, it aims to boost output of orthodox tea to as much as 12% of total production from 8% to 10% now.

India's overall tea exports are unlikely to return to pre-pandemic levels due to payment issues with Russia and Iran following U.S. sanctions, said Atul Asthana, managing director of plantation firm Goodricke Group Ltd. Both Russia and Iran are major buyers of Indian tea.

He added that some shipments of Goodricke are stuck due to the war in Ukraine. It's also unable to ship to Iran because of sanctions.

India's exports sank 6.8% in 2021 from a year earlier to 195.5 million kilograms, data from Tea Board India show. Shipments totaled 252.15 million kilograms in 2019.
