COMMENTS

This week's Tea Auction, namely Sale #47 was held on December 8 (Mon.)/9 (Tue.), 2025. A total weight of 5.2 MKGS was on offer, which shows a decrease when compared to the previous week's quantity. The Low Grown Leafy, Semi Leafy, Tippy/Small Leaf & Premium Flowery catalogues totaled 2.2 MKGS, while the Main Sale High & Medium segment had 0.6 MKGS. The Ex Estate category had 0.7 MKGS.

This week Ex-Estate sale witnessed an improved demand with prices realizing a dearer trend. Best Western BOP's where quality was maintained gained Rs.20-40/-, whilst others sold around last levels. In the below best category, clean leaf teas with fair liquors appreciated by Rs.50/- and more whilst plainer sorts were Rs.20-40/- dearer. Best Western BOPF's in the high price bracket of the last sale were easier with the exception of the wider selection of better teas which appreciated up to Rs.50/-. In the below best category, clean leaf teas gained Rs.50-100/- whilst others advanced Rs.20-40/-. Lower end teas were upto Rs.20/- dearer. The majority of the Nuwara Eliya teas were firm to dearer. Uva/Udapussellawa BOP's gained upto Rs.50/-, whilst their corresponding BOPF's were fully firm to Rs.20-40/- dearer. CTC Teas – High & Medium PF1's sold around last levels whilst Low Grown declined Rs.20-40/-. There were hardly any BP1's on offer this week. There was strong and improved demand from shippers to Japan, the Continent and South Africa along with other shippers to Russia, CIS, China & Hongkong. The Tea bag sector was too active.

Demand for Low Grown teas in all categories continued to meet with strong inquiry and thus prices were fully firm to dearer alround. Bright Tippy Teas too maintained last auction price levels and at times more. Traditional markets continued to be operative.

Sale No.48 which was originally due to be held on 9th /10th December, 2025 has been re-scheduled for 15th /16th December 2025.

This week's auction comprised of **10,785** lots with a total quantity of **5,263,732** Kgs.

Sri Lanka's tea sector recorded a welcome improvement in November 2025, with the National Tea Sale Average (NTSA) posting gains across most elevations compared to the previous month, even as overall performance for the year continues to lag behind 2024.

According to the Sri Lanka Tea Board, the NTSA for November reached Rs.1,198.39 (USD 3.91), marking an increase of Rs.21.25 and USD 0.04 over October. This recovery also extended year-on-year, with November's average improving by Rs.61.17 and USD 0.02 compared to November 2024.

The month's elevation-wise performance showed mixed results. High Grown teas recorded steady gains, rising by Rs.10.33 and USD 0.01 month-on-month, while also strengthening against last year with increases of Rs. 64.63 and USD 0.04. Low Grown teas, which continue to dominate national auction volumes, posted the strongest growth, improving by Rs.26.75 and USD 0.06 compared to October, and rising Rs. 67.20 and USD 0.03 against November 2024. However, Medium Grown teas dipped marginally during the month, recording a decline of Rs.0.73 and USD 0.03. Despite this, the category still posted a rupee-based year-on-year increase of Rs.39.99, although USD earnings edged lower by 0.03. While November's performance brought some positive sentiment to the market, the broader picture remains subdued. The cumulative NTSA for the January–November 2025 period stood at Rs.1,164.97 (USD 3.88), a decline of Rs.63.49 and USD 0.17 compared to the corresponding period last year. All three elevation High, Medium, and Low recorded negative variances in both rupee and dollar terms over the eleven-month period.

Industry analysts note that although the November recovery is significant, persistent cost pressures, fluctuating global demand, and competitive pricing from other origins continue to weigh on Sri Lanka's tea export earnings. Stakeholders say sustained improvement will be crucial to stabilise the sector as it heads into 2026.
