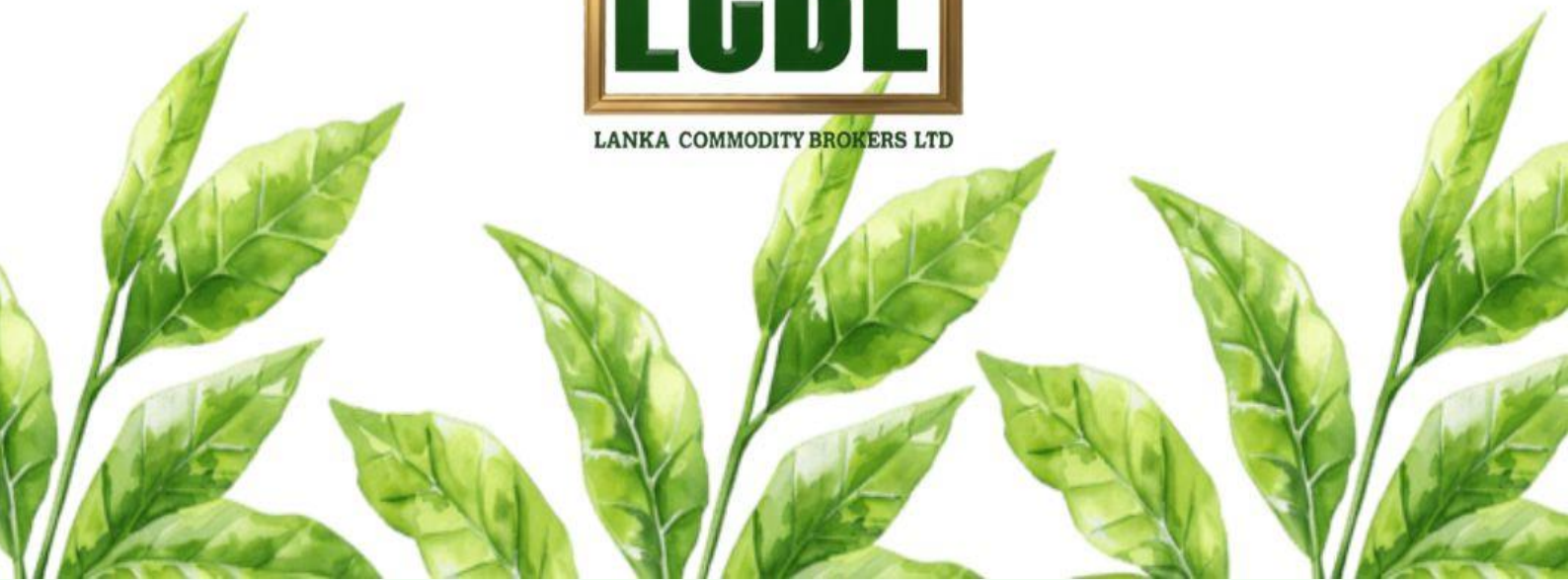

COMMENTS

This week's Tea Auction, namely Sale #01 was held on January 6 (Mon)/7 (Tue), 2025. A total weight of 5.7 MKGS was on offer, which shows an increase when compared to the previous week. The Low Grown Leafy, Semi Leafy, Tippy/Small Leaf & Premium Flowery catalogues totaled 2.5 MKGS, while the Main Sale High & Medium segment had 0.6 MKGS. The Ex Estate category had 0.7 MKGS.

The first Ex-estate sale for 2026 was held today which met with irregular demand. Select best Western BOP's/BOPF's were firm to Rs.50/- dearer but the balance were barely maintained and were irregularly easier. Below Best and Plainer teas too followed a similar trend. Nuwara Eliya teas met with less demand whilst Uva/Udapussellawa's too were an irregular feature. CTC Teas- High & Medium PF1's were Rs.20-40/- easier whilst Low grown PF1's were firm to Rs.20/- lower. There were hardly any BP1's on offer this week. The limited availability of better liquoring teas were selectively sought after by shippers to Japan and the Continent whilst the balance was accounted for by Shippers to Russia, CIS and China.

The Low grown market across all catalogues met with lower demand and lost in value when compared with the previous sale. The main contributory factor in lower price levels and demand was due to the conflict currently experienced in the Middle East & Iran countries with buyers following the situation very closely.

Next week sale No.02 will be held on Monday 12th and Tuesday 13th January 2026 owing to Thai Pongal Festival.

This week's auction comprised of **11,915** lots with a total quantity of **5,794,884** Kgs.
